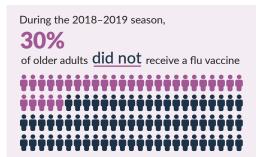
People

- No country-wide, harmonized immunization program
 12 out of 13 provinces or territories offer a free influenza vaccine for:
 - People aged 65 and over
 - Children and adults with severe chronic conditions

Government Campaign

The Public Health Agency of Canada (PHAC), which has a mission to promote and protect the health of Canadians, leads the national influenza awareness campaign by providing public messages to support informed decision making on vaccination.
